

Breaking Barriers: A Decade of Race Equality Insights



Black Pay Gap

Black* employees were the only ethnic minority group to consistently earn less than White employees between 2012 and 2022.

In 2022 the <u>pay gap</u> between Black* employees and White employees was 5.7%.

Pensions

The average ethnically diverse person's pension pot is £52,333 - 46% of the size of their White British counterparts.



Only 1.3% of officers in England and Wales are from a Black or Black British background.

NEET

Young Black Caribbean people represent 1.5% of the 18-24 population in England and Wales yet face the highest NEET rate of any ethnic group at 29.4%.

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Senior Civil Service

Only 100 Senior Civil Servants declared their ethnicity as Black as of March 2023. (less than 1%)



Wealth

Ethnically diverse people are more likely to have a university degree, yet nearly 40% of Black

African graduates are in non-graduate jobs compared to 20% of White graduates.



FTSE 100

3.7% of leaders in the Top 3 positions (CEO, Chair and CFO) are from an ethnically diverse background.

There are no black leaders in C-suite roles at FTSE 100 companies.

Investment Organisations

Less than 1% of investment managers identify as Black*.



Education



2.7% of headteachers in 2023/24 were Black. In 2022 the number of Black academic staff rose by 18% but

black people only make up 1% of all professors.

Politicians

In 2024, **90 of the UK's 650 Members of Parliament were ethnically diverse**(13.8%). The most diverse it has ever been.
