

# A DAY IN SPITALFIELDS

HRH The Prince of Wales, President of BiC, returned to Spitalfields in February 1989 to see training schemes which are bridging the gap between City of London employers and the unemployed in the East End of London. The Prince's tour ended at the Lloyd's Building in the City.
